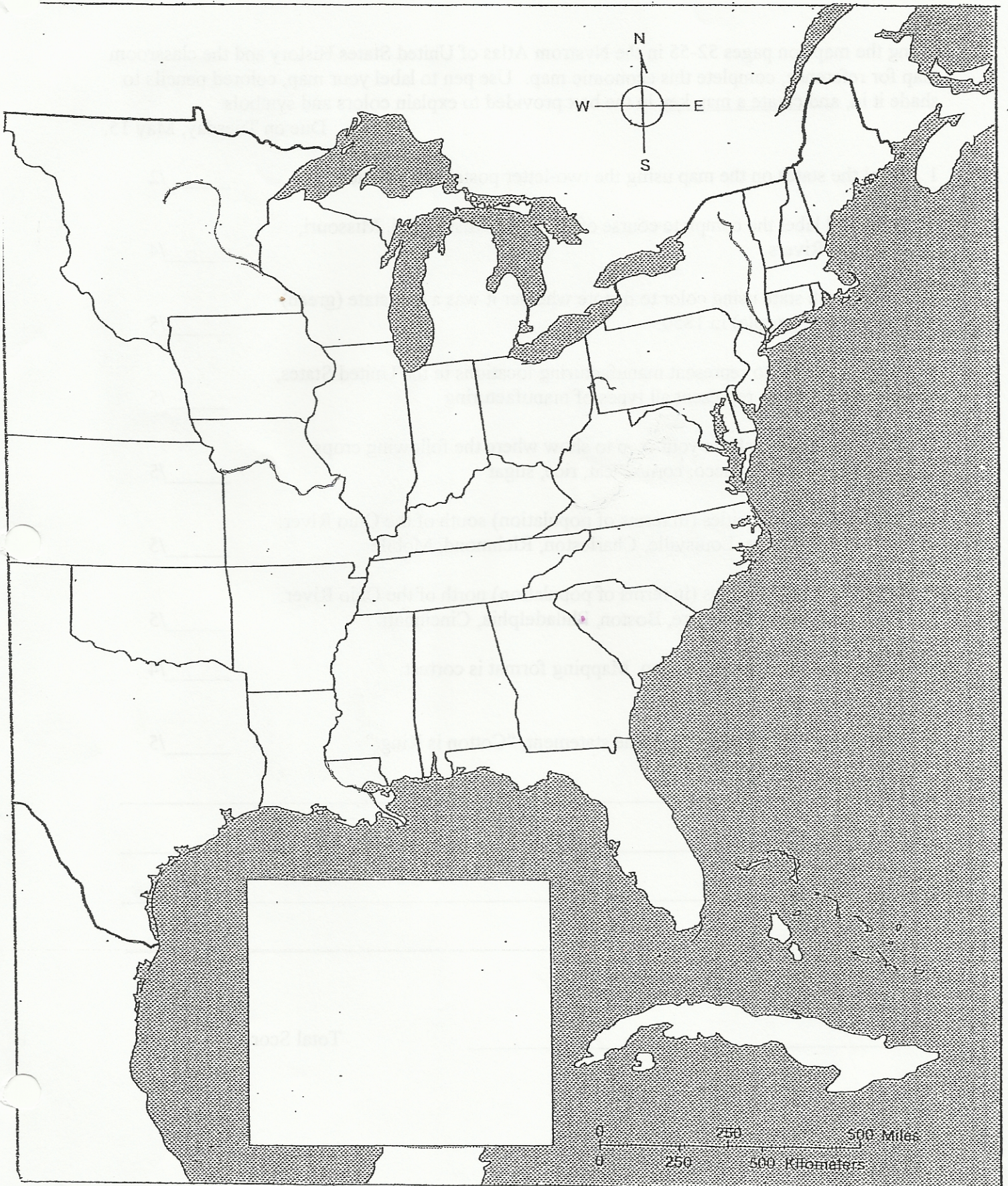


# Northern and Southern Economies in the 1850's
